Optical Splitters An optical splitter is a passive device that divides a single optical signal into two or more output signals without requiring power. Common types include Fused Biconical Tapered (FBT) and Planar Lightwave Circuit (PLC) splitters. Splitters are used to distribute optical signals efficiently to multiple subscribers, enabling simultaneous transmission over a single fiber line. They do not provide fiber protection, splicing, or termination functions—they only split the signal.
