

Cable trays do not require fireproof partitions



Overview

Cable trays must remain in open, accessible areas to allow for proper maintenance. This document outlines the key requirements for cable tray layout, installation, and fireproofing in industrial and commercial environments. Grounding: Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC) if they meet NEC requirements. Fill Limits: For power cables, the fill must not exceed 40% of the tray's. Cable trays and busways at floor level or at slab penetrations shall have a waterstop no less than 50 mm in height. At slab penetrations, provide 20-30 mm of firestopping and install a fire-support plate at the top. For large. Therefore, it is crucial to set up fire-blocking sections (fire sections/fire partitions) on cable trays and select appropriate fire-blocking sections (fire sections/fire partitions) materials.
