Installation Best Practices Ensure the cover is centered and flush with the tray edges. Secure covers using appropriate hardware such as screws, flanged nuts, or self-tapping fasteners, following torque specifications provided by the manufacturer. For solid trays installed outdoors or in humid areas, drill 1/4-inch weep holes every 3 feet to prevent water accumulation. Verify that the tray system is accessible and supported according to load requirements, avoiding installation in hoist ways or areas prone to physical damage. Make sure all surfaces of the pulling devices that come in contact with the cable and ladder tray are covered by a protective covering of plastic or tape to prevent surface scoring.
