

Can a switch be connected to a core gateway

A core switch can have a default gateway, but whether it functions as a gateway depends on its Layer 3 capabilities and network design. Core Switch as a Gateway A core switch is typically the backbone of a network, connecting distribution and access switches and handling high volumes of traffic with low latency. In Layer 3 core switches, the device can perform routing between VLANs and subnets, effectively acting as a gateway for devices within those VLANs. In this case, the core switch itself may have Switched Virtual Interfaces (SVIs) for each VLAN, and these SVIs serve as the default gateway for devices in their respective subnets. Default Gateway Configuration Even if a core switch performs Layer 3 routing, it may still require a default gateway to reach external networks, such as the internet or a firewall. The default gateway is usually the IP address of the firewall or upstream router that connects the internal network to external networks. For Layer 2 switches connected to the core, the default gateway is typically the SVI on the core switch corresponding to the management VLAN. Layer 2 vs Layer 3 Core Switches Layer 2 core switch: Primarily performs switching and does not route traffic. It may still have a management IP and a default gateway to allow remote administration. Layer 3 core switch: Performs routing between VLANs and can act as the gateway for all internal subnets. It may also have a default gateway pointing to a firewall or upstream router for external traffic. Practical Considerations For inter-VLAN routing, assign SVIs on the core switch and use these as default gateways for devices in each VLAN. For internet access, configure the core switch with a default gateway pointing to the firewall or router that connects to the WAN. In complex networks, it is common to create a dedicated VLAN for management and firewall traffic to isolate routing and improve...
