For concealed installations, supports may be hidden within walls, ceilings, or raised floors. Ensure all supports are level and aligned, and use splice plates or couplers to join tray sections seamlessly.

Cable Installation Lay cables carefully to avoid kinks or damage. Use cable rollers for long runs and maintain proper separation between power and data cables. For concealed trays, consider removable access panels or junction boxes to allow future maintenance without dismantling walls or ceilings.
