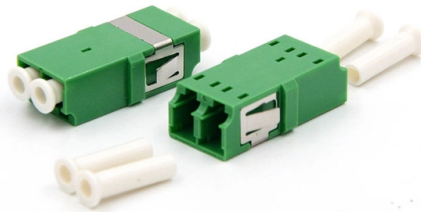

- Damaged insulation:** Over time, insulation may deteriorate, exposing conductive elements.

Regulatory and Safety Considerations Both OSHA and NFPA require that wiring energized at 50 volts or higher be properly insulated and protected, particularly if it is within reach (below eight feet from the ground).
