

How to add more ports when the optical splitter is full

3. Cascaded Splitter Architecture: You can cascade splitters by connecting a smaller splitter to one output of a larger splitter. For instance, a 1:4 splitter feeding into four 1:4 splitters effectively creates 16 outputs. This approach allows flexible network expansion but requires careful calculation of insertion loss to ensure each endpoint receives sufficient optical power.

.Considerations for Expansion

Insertion Loss: Each split reduces signal strength. Higher split ratios or cascaded splitters increase loss, so ensure the optical budget of your network can accommodate it.

Splitter Type: PLC splitters are ideal for uniform distribution and large-scale deployments, while FBT splitters are suitable for smaller, cost-sensitive networks.

Connector Compatibility: Ensure new splitters match existing fiber connectors (SC, LC, FC) and wavelength requirements (e.g., GPON 1260–1650...
