

How to check for optical module faults

Step 4: Check for Common Fault Symptoms

- Port not UP:** Could be due to mismatched speed/duplex, module incompatibility, or faulty hardware.
- Link instability or drops:** Often caused by dirty connectors, damaged cables, or aging modules.
- Signal attenuation:** May result from fiber contamination, damaged cables, or degraded module components.
- High power usage or overheating:** Indicates potential electronic failure or laser drift.

Step 5: Component-Level Troubleshooting If abnormal parameters are detected, compare voltage, resistance, and waveform with a known good module. Identify faulty components such as TOSA, ROSA, or PCBA circuits, and replace them if necessary.
