- 5. Weather-Resistant Materials** Labels and signs must withstand construction site conditions, including rain, mud, and UV exposure. Use UV-resistant ink and secure attachment methods such as grommets, zip ties, or screws to prevent signs from falling or becoming unreadable ().
- 6. Placement and Visibility** Labels should be placed on the front or top of the distribution box where they are easily visible to workers. Ensure that signs are not obstructed by equipment, debris, or temporary structures ().
