

How to use a single-core optical module

To insert a single-core optical module, align the module with the port, slide it straight in until it clicks, and then connect the fiber after cleaning both ends.

Step-by-Step Installation

1. Prepare the Module and Port
Keep the dust caps on the module and fiber until ready to connect. Inspect the module and port for damage or debris. Identify the alignment key on the module and match it to the port keyway, as single-core modules only fit one orientation.
2. Handle Safely
Hold the module by its housing or pull-tab, not the gold contacts, to prevent ESD damage. Wear an ESD wrist strap or touch a grounded metal surface before handling.

Slide the module straight into the port along the horizontal axis. Apply firm, even pressure; do not twist, rock, or force it. Push until you feel a distinct click, indicating the latch has engaged. Some modules may require gently pressing a latch to secure it.
4. Connect the Fiber
Remove the dust caps from the module's optical bore and the fiber connector. Clean the fiber end-face using a click-type cleaner or lint-free wipe with isopropyl alcohol to prevent signal loss. Align the fiber connector key with the module slot and push straight in until it clicks. Never look directly into an active fiber port.
5. Verify Connection
Ensure the module is fully seated and the fiber is properly connected. Check the network device for link status to confirm proper operation.

Special Considerations for Single-Core Modules
Single-core modules use WDM technology to transmit and receive data on a single fiber, so they must be paired with a matching module at the other end for bidirectional communication. They save fiber resources but require careful wavelength matching to function correctly. Only one fiber is inserted at a time, unlike dual-fiber modules. By following these steps and precautions, you can safely install a single-core optical module, maintain port integrity, and ensure reliable network performance.
