- Direct ONT connection:** In some residential fiber installations, the fiber drop can be connected directly to an ONT without a separate terminal box, with the fiber coiled in a small Network Interface Device (NID) outside the home.
- Pre-connected systems:** Pre-connected terminal boxes or pre-terminated cables allow installers to bypass field termination, connecting fibers directly to the network or device.
- Short or simple runs:** For short fi...
