Additionally, the conduit should be supported near the tray entry using brackets or clamps to reduce stress on the cables and maintain alignment.

Compliance with Standards All installations should comply with the National Electrical Code (NEC) or relevant local standards, which cover conduit-to-tray connections, grounding, and spacing requirements. Using certified fittings and following manufacturer guidelines ensures both safety and warranty compliance.
