A non-contact voltage tester can help determine this: the live wire is the line, and the wire showing no voltage is the load leading to downstream devices. Properly connecting the load end ensures that all downstream circuits are protected and that the distribution box functions safely and efficiently. In modern installations, the load end also allows for monitoring and maintenance, making it easier to identify and isolate problems in specific circuits.
