Clearance Requirements for Electrical Equipment Electrical panels and distribution boxes require adequate working and dedicated space to allow safe operation, inspection, and maintenance. Height clearance: From the floor to 6 feet above the equipment or to the structural ceiling, whichever is lower. Dedicated electrical rooms or corridor-mounted panels should never be used for storage, and the path in front of the equipment must remain clear for emergency egress. Corridor Egress and Obstruction Rules According to the International Building Code (IBC): The required width of corridors must remain unobstructed. Objects such as furniture or equipment are only permissible if the minimum clear width is maintained. The minimum corridor width is generally 44 inches, with exceptions for access to electrical, mechanical, or plumbing systems, which may allow narrower widths (e.g., 24 inches for equipment access). An obstruction is considered a violation only if it reduces the required egress width. Maintaining these clearances ensures that occupants can safely evacuate during emergencies and that personnel can access electrical equipment without risk.
