Number of Devices and Terminals: Each device typically requires two cores—one for sending and one for receiving data. Redundancy may require additional cores, often 10–20% more than the minimum needed.

Redundancy and Future-Proofing: Networks often include spare cores to accommodate future expansion or equipment failure. For example, a 6-core cable may use two cores for active connections, two as spares, and two for redundancy.

Network Type and Distance: Single-mode fibers are preferred for long-distance outdoor transmission, while multi-mode fibers are suitable for shorter distances, such as within buildings or campuses.

Wiring Standards: According to IBDN standards, communication rooms in buildings typically use 12-core cables, while building-to-building connections may use 24-core cables.

Practical Considerations

Cost: Higher core count cables are more expensive, so network designers balance cost with scalability and redundancy.

Signal Loss: While one core can connect multiple devices in series, excessive splicing increases optical attenuation, which can limit long-distance transmission.
