Ensure the main breaker matches the supply voltage and amperage. Circuit Distribution: Each branch circuit should be protected by a breaker sized for the connected load. Avoid overloading circuits to prevent overheating and fire hazards. GFCI Protection: All 125V, single-phase, 15A, 20A, and 30A receptacles must have GFCI protection, either built into the breaker or via a GFCI outlet, especially in wet or outdoor areas. Grounding and Bonding: Connect the grounding conductor from the supply to the box and ensure all metal enclosures and equipment are bonded. This prevents electric shock in case of a fault. Cable Management: Use heavy-duty, outdoor-rated extension cords and secure them to prevent tripping hazards. Avoid running cables through water or sharp edges. Inspection and Maintenance: Conduct daily visual inspections for damaged cords, loose connections, or exposed wires. Test GFCI devices before first use and after any repair. Safety and Compliance NEC Article 590 governs temporary wiring, limiting use to 90 days unless extended and requiring all equipment to be rated for site conditions.
