Safety: Connecting multiple machines to a single switch can bypass the hierarchical protection system, increasing the risk of overloads, short circuits, or electrical hazards.
Protection Compliance: Tertiary boxes are equipped with residual current devices (RCDs) or leakage protection switches. Sharing a switch among multiple machines compromises individual protection and violates construction and electrical standards.
Maintenance and Control: Individual switches allow for easier isolation of a single machine for maintenance without affecting other equipment.
Practical Considerations
Branching: While primary and secondary distribution boxes can branch power to multiple downstream boxes, tertiary boxes must not branch to multiple machines.
Distance: Keep the distance b...
