- Push-In Terminal Blocks:** Allow direct insertion of stripped wires without tools, often used for single-core wires.
- Multi-Level Terminal Blocks:** Provide multiple connection tiers in one block, saving space and supporting complex wiring.
- Fused Terminal Blocks:** Include a fuse in the busbar for overcurrent protection, sometimes with LED indicators for fault detection.
- Disconnect/Switch Blocks:** Enable easy disconnection of wires via a lever or switch without removing the wire.
- I/O and Sensor Blocks:** Facilitate connections between controllers and devices, handling multiple wires for actuators or sensors.
- Power Distribution Blocks:** Distribute a single input to multiple outputs efficiently, ideal for high-current applications.

Key Considerations for Selection

When choosing terminal blocks for a wiring cabinet, consider:

- Wire Gauge:** Ensure compatibility with the conductor size (AWG or mm²) and type (stranded or solid).
- Voltage and Current Ratings:** Select blocks rated above the system's maximum voltage and at least 150% of the maximum current.
